Your Leadership Styles

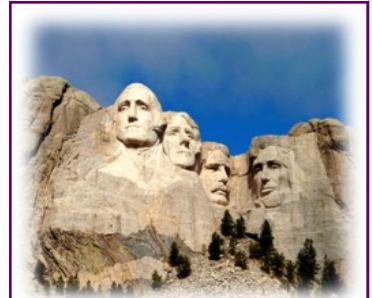
Do you know your predominate leadership style?
